PAUL'S LETTER TO THE PHILIPPIANS – LESSON 11 PHILIPPIANS 4:10-23 WEEK OF DECEMBER 1 – DECEMBER 6

CONTENTMENT AND THANKSGIVING

The letter to the Philippians is a long thank you note from Paul for the gifts carried by Epaphroditus from the Philippian church to bless and provide for Paul's needs. In these 4 chapters of Philippians, Paul expresses his deep joy and contentment resulting not from his circumstances but from knowing Christ, deeply and intimately. In **Philippians 4:10-23**, Paul closes his Philippian letter reflecting on the significance of the gift from them while at the same time he communicates his unshakeable contentment found in Christ alone.

| 2. | In Phil. 4:11 , Paul uses the word content which speaks of being sufficient, having enough, or to be satisfied. In verses 11-12 , what does Paul say about the relationship between his contentment and his circumstances? |
| "Paul was content because he knew that the times, seasons and opportunities of life are controlled by the sovereign God "who works all things after the council is will" (Eph. 1:11), thereby causing "all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). Those who seek to control their own lives will inevitably be frustrated. A confident trust in God's providence is foundational to contentment."
